Science

Plants

Children will:

- Know the parts of a plant.
- Understand the basic functions of each part of a plant.
- Explore which garden and wild plants grow in our local area
- Know about deciduous and evergreen trees.

Seasonal Changes

- Understand what weather is.
- Know how the weather changes across the seasons.
- Understand how we can measure rainfall.
- Know what hibernation is and why it happens in the animal kingdom
- Describe how trees change across the seasons

Maths

In our maths lessons over the term we will be learning the following topics:

- Number – Multiplication and Division (Counting in 2s, 5, 10s)
- Number – Fractions
- Geometry – Position and direction
- Number – Place Value
- Measurement – Time and Money

Religion and Worldviews

Thematic Curriculum

Geography – Countries, Capitals and Seas of the UK

Children will:

- Consolidate knowledge of the name and location of the 4 countries (England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland) and capital cities of the U.K (London, Edinburgh, Cardiff, Belfast)
- Use positional and directional language such as forward, backwards, left, right, turn
- Use the 4 compass points, North, South, East and West when talking about locations Know the names of the 4 seas that surround the UK- English Channel, Irish Sea, Atlantic Ocean, North Seas
